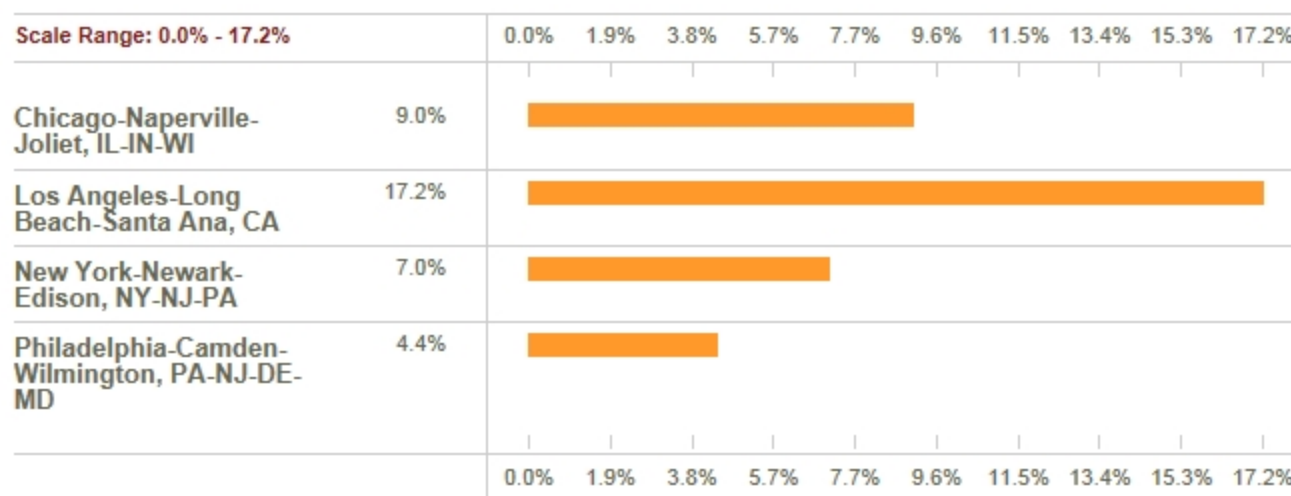


## Percent Change in Population Age 65 and Over

In 2001, Broomfield became its own county and part of the Denver, CO metro area, where it is included in 2010 counts.
