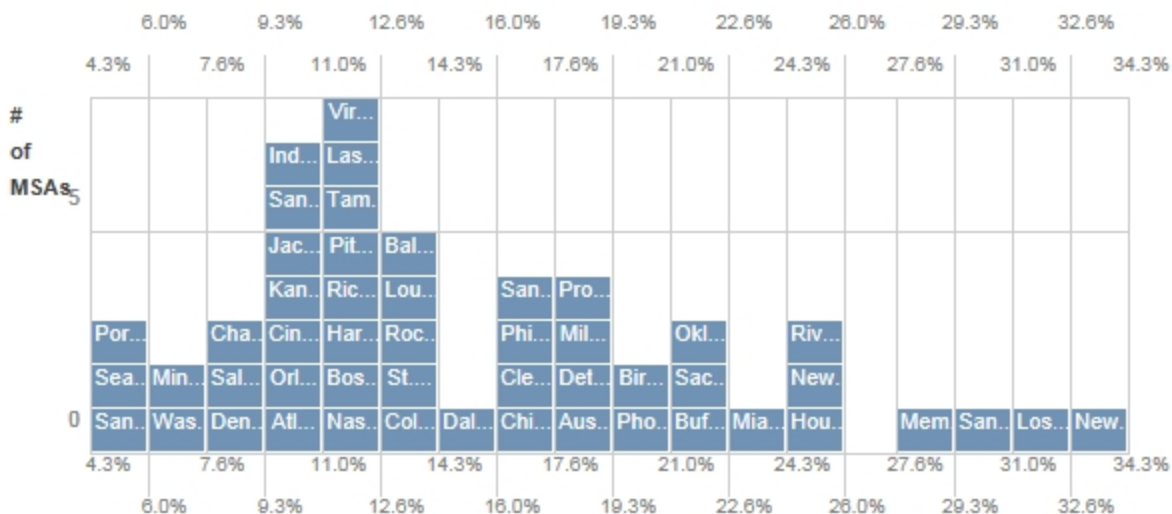


Share of Population Living in High Poverty Neighborhoods
